

An adult will begin the game and use instructions such as "Simon says hop left", "Simon says put your right hand up", "Simon says move backwards" and so on. To get a player out, you give an instruction without using 'Simon says' such as "Put your left hand up" and if the player moves then they are out.</p>

This is very similar to how columns are used to support buildings and other structures. <b>Challenge instructions:</b>	
				<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Use regular copy paper, not card stock.</li> <li>• Fold each paper into the three shapes and secure with tape.</li> </ul>	

- Slowly pile books on top of each shape.
- How many books can you pile on top of each shape?**

Things to think about!  
Are the shoes the same colour? Do all the shoes have laces?  
Categories the footwear into categories such as, laces, boots, thongs, without laces, slippers etc or colours.  
Which shoe was there the most?  
Which shoe was there the least?  
How many shoes are there altogether?

**Alphabet Ball**

First, have an adult call out a letter/sound and the student responds with a word that begins with that letter. Then, the adult throws the ball to the student and the student gives the adult a letter to find a word for, and on and on. You can make the game even more fun by kicking the ball or chasing each other to tag with the ball.
