
Monday

You can write an:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Action Hook - Sound Effect Hook - Question Hook </div> <div data-bbox="938 1339 1449 1621" style="border: 1px solid black; padding: 5px;"> <p>Backfill</p> <p>Backfill goes back and gives us the rest of the orientation. It includes:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Who - When - Where - What </div> </div>		
Reading	Read for at least 10 minutes a book of your choice.		
Comprehension	Choose a book you have read. Read it again and then write a summary. A summary is when you explain what happens in a story to someone else. A good summary will include the characters, setting and what happens in the beginning, the middle and the end.		
Maths TEN	Roll dice 2 times (or use playing cards) and do six 2 digit + 2 digit additions. Practice using the jump strategy.






Spelling	Write 2 spelling words in a sentence each in your book.

Writing	<p>Write a Show Don't Tell (descriptive paragraph) about a snake you might find in the garden.</p> <div style="display: flex; align-items: flex-start;">  <div style="border: 1px solid black; padding: 5px; width: 300px;"> <p>Show Don't Tell</p> <p>Remember to use your adjectives (descriptive words) and your senses (see, smell, hear, touch, taste and feel).</p> <p>You can't tell the reader what it is until the final sentence.</p> </div> </div>
Reading	Read for at least 10 mins a book of your choice
Comprehension	Write 3 questions you would ask the author about the book you summarised yesterday.
Maths TEN	Roll dice 2 times (or use playing cards) and do six 2 digit + 2 digit additions. Practice using the jump strategy.

Write a persuasive text to him tell the reasons why.</p> <div data-bbox="363 640 1217 931" style="border: 1px solid black; padding: 10px;"><p>Remember to include:</p><ul style="list-style-type: none">- Introduction- 3 reasons why and explain your reasons (Eg. You must clean the house to stay healthy. If you do no clean the house there will be lots of germs and you could get sick all the time)- Conclusion</div> 
Reading	Read for at least 10 mins a book of your choice
Comprehension	Draw a picture of the scene you enjoyed the most (visualise) from the book
Maths TEN	<p>Roll dice 2 times (or use playing cards) and do six 2 digit + 2 digit additions. Practice using the jump strategy.</p> <div data-bbox="376 1317 748 1576" style="border: 2px dashed blue; padding: 10px;"><p style="text-align: center;">JUMP STRATEGY</p><p style="text-align: center;"><small>The jump strategy is when you use a number line to jump in tens and ones to arrive at the answer.</small></p><p style="text-align: center;">$32 - 25 = 7$</p></div>



Sentence of the Day	<p>Write a question that you would like to ask your teacher. Remember to include a capital letter and a question mark.</p>
Writing	<p>Write a Pebble, Rock and Boulder based on the following picture. Don't forget to use your senses to tighten the tension.</p> <div style="display: flex; align-items: center;">  <div style="border: 1px solid black; padding: 10px; margin-left: 20px;"> <p>Pebble – a small problem</p> <p>Rock – a slightly bigger problem</p> <p>Boulder – a huge problem</p> <p>Remember:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - you want the reader to think that your character is going to fail. - BAN the boring and be creative. </div> </div>
Reading	<p>Read for at least 10 mins a book of your choice</p>
Comprehension	<p>Read a book and work out what the main message of the book is. Eg. Pig the Pug, the main message of the book is that being selfish is not nice.</p>
Maths TOWN	<p>Roll dice 2 times (or use playing cards) and do six 2 digit + 2 digit additions. Practice using the jump strategy.</p>
