














# Year 3 and 4 2022



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Welcome to Year 3 and 4 and what we hope will be a year of learning and fun in 2022. Year 3 and 4 teachers have a wonderful year planned with lots of new and exciting opportunities for our students.

**Equipment:** No equipment is required for Year 3 and 4 students, though if students would like to bring their own pencil cases they may.

**Excursion:** In 2022, we hope to offer students a number of exciting opportunities. We are working hard planning an excursion for Term 2 for both grades and will let parents know as soon as possible when details have been finalised.

**Uniforms:** The standards we set and the pride we take in our school is largely reflected in the way we wear our uniform. Students are encouraged to wear full school uniform every day including black shoes, school jackets and hats. On Friday's students are able to wear their house colour shirt and sports joggers.

**Book work:** All teachers of Year 3 and 4 set a high standard for students' bookwork and handwriting. Bookwork will be monitored regularly to ensure that best bookwork is consistently applied and books are free from graffiti.

**Homework:** Homework aids in the consolidation of work completed in the classroom. We encourage all students to read every day. Students will be given weekly activities on Mathematics and Spelling words will be sent home via SeeSaw every Monday.

**School Photos:** School photos will take place this year on *Monday 14 March 2022*.

**Academic Programs:** As part of our quality literacy instruction all staff have been trained in Seven Steps to Writing Success and SMART Spelling programs. We will continue to

implement these programs again this year. For mathematics lessons, year 3 and 4 teachers will follow the DoE syllabus. Students will be taught number, algebra, measurement, geometry, statistics and probability as well as problem solving.

**Food:** It is important that students are provided with enough healthy food each day to help them concentrate and learn. Every class will include a short 'Crunch and Sip' time in the morning. Students are encouraged to pack a piece of fresh fruit or vegetables to eat during this time. Nut Aware- We have several children who are anaphylactic, and any contact with nut or products containing nut could be potentially life threatening. Parents are encouraged to keep student's lunches free of nuts, (e.g. peanut butter and Nutella).

**Behaviour:** As with all grades at Rosemeadow P.S. we expect the very best in behaviour of all students in Year 3 and 4. Our school rules are 'Be Safe, Be Respectful and Be a Learner' and our students are expected to follow these rules at all times. Our whole school positive behaviour reward system of merit awards, banners and ribbons will continue to be used to celebrate our students' successes and their hard work. Behaviour will be closely monitored and tracked with the school's welfare tracking program. Teachers will endeavour to communicate all issues with parents at the earliest convenience and we encourage open communication if you have any concerns. If behaviour is not acceptable students may not be permitted to attend school events such as Gala Days, excursions, or end of term discos.



**Sport:** Due to the current restrictions, Gala Days have been cancelled for Term 1. We are hoping they will recommence in Term 2. We are currently organising inter school sport for this Term. More information will follow. Year 3 and Year 4 sport times will be Wednesdays and Fridays.



**Attendance:** It is important that students are at school before 9:00am. If your child arrives after 9:00am, then they need to go to the office to receive a late note before heading to class. When your child is sick or absent from school it is a legal requirement for an explanation to be provided. This can be done by either speaking with your class teacher, sending a message on seesaw or providing a written note or doctor's certificate.
