Welcome to Year 3 and 4 and what we hope will be a year of learning and fun in 2024. Year 3 and 4 teachers have a wonderful year planned with lots of new and exciting opportunities for our students.

Equipment: No equipment is required for Year 3 and 4 students, though if students would like to bring their own pencil cases they may.

Excursion: In 2024, we hope to offer students a number of exciting opportunities. We are working hard planning an excursion for Term 2 for both grades and will let parents know as soon as possible when details have been finalised.

Uniforms: The standards we set and the pride we take in our school is largely reflected in the way we wear our uniform. Students are encouraged to wear full school uniform every day including black shoes, school jackets and hats. On Friday's students are able to wear their house colour shirt and sports joggers.

Book work: All teachers of Year 3 and 4 set a high standard for students' bookwork and handwriting. Bookwork will be monitored regularly to ensure that best bookwork is consistently applied and books are free from graffiti. Students will cover their books together as a class at school.

Homework: Homework aides in the consolidation of work completed in the classroom. We encourage all students to complete their homework as part of their weekly routine. Homework will be posted on Sentral each Monday.

School Photos: School photos will take place this year on *Monday 18th March 2024*.

Extravaganza: This year students from K-6 will be rehearsing a dance performance to perform on the stage at Event Cinemas Macarthur Square. Student performances will be filmed to be made into a movie. This will then be screened at Event Cinemas

Macarthur with tickets available to purchase through Event Cinemas for the whole family to watch. More information will come in Term 2.

Academic Programs: As part of our quality curriculum instruction, we will be enacting the Department of Education's literacy and numeracy programs including increased focus on grammar, text studies and thinking creatively in Mathematics.

Food: It is important that students are provided with enough healthy food each day to help them concentrate and learn. Every class will include a short 'Crunch and Sip' time in the morning. Students are encouraged to pack a piece of fresh fruit or vegetables to eat during this time. Nut Aware- We have several children who are anaphylactic, and any contact with nut or products containing nut could be potentially life threatening. Parents are encouraged to keep student's lunches free of nuts, (e.g. peanut butter and Nutella).

Behaviour: As with all grades at Rosemeadow P.S. we expect the very best in behaviour of all students in Years 3 and 4. Our school rules are 'Be Safe, Be Respectful and Be a Learner' and our students are expected to follow these rules at all times. Our whole school positive behaviour reward system of merit awards, banners and ribbons will continue to be used to celebrate our students' successes and their hard work. Behaviour will be closely monitored and tracked with the school's welfare tracking program. Teachers will endeavour to communicate all issues with parents at the earliest convenience and we encourage open communication if you have any concerns. If behaviour is not acceptable students may not be permitted to attend school events such as Gala Days, excursions, or end of term discos.



Sport: Gala Day training is on each Friday. Gala Days will take place twice a term, in weeks 7 and 10 (Term One), weeks 4 and 8 (Term Two), weeks 4 and 8 (Term Three) and weeks 2 and 4 (Term Four).



Attendance: It is important that students are at school before 9:00am. If your child arrives after 9:00am, then they need to go to the office to receive a late note before heading to class. When your child is sick or absent from school it is a legal requirement for an explanation to be provided. This can be done by either speaking with your class teacher, sending a message on seesaw or providing a written note or doctor's certificate.
