Camp: In 2024, we have planned an exciting camp to Tea Gardens. This year the camp will take place over 3 days and 2 nights. Notes have been sent home on Sentral.



The cost of the camp will be approx. \$395. Start saving your pocket money NOW!!!!. A deposit will be required in Term 1 to secure your child's place.

Uniforms: It is extremely important that Year 5 and 6, as a team, work to set a high standard for all students at Rosemeadow. The standards we set and the pride we take in our school is largely reflected in the way we wear our uniform. It is important that **ALL** students wear their full school uniform everyday including a school hat. As the cooler days approach, we notice an increase in coloured jackets. Coloured or patterned jackets are not appropriate for school use and are much better kept for weekend and after school wear. Unfortunately, when children are not in school uniform we often notice a change in their behaviour. Students are required to wear full school uniform every school day and wear them for each day until the end of the year. Students will be expected to wear black shoes each day, except for Friday when we have sport.

Bookwork: All teachers of Year 5 and 6 set a high standard for students' bookwork and handwriting. Bookwork will be monitored regularly to ensure that the best bookwork is consistently applied, and books are free from mess and graffiti. All books will be covered and provided to students.

Academic Programs: Due to the recent Curriculum Reform, the new 3-6 Syllabus for English and Mathematics, is being implemented this year. More information regarding how we teach Literacy and Numeracy will be available throughout the year.

Food: It is important that students are provided with enough healthy food each day to help them concentrate and learn.

Crunch and Sip- Every class will include a short Crunch and Sip time in the classroom. Students are encouraged to pack a piece of fresh fruit or vegetables to eat. Fresh fruit, vegetables and water only are allowed during this time.

Nut Aware- We have several children who are anaphylactic, and any contact with nuts or products including nuts could be potentially life threatening. Parents are encouraged to ensure student's lunches are free from nuts, (eg. no peanut butter and nutella).

Extravaganza: This year students from K-6 will be rehearsing a dance performance to perform on the stage at Event Cinemas Macarthur Square. Student performances will be filmed to be made into a movie. This will then be screened at Event Cinemas

Macarthur with tickets available to purchase through Event Cinemas for the whole family to watch. More information will come in Term 2.

Behaviour: As with all grades at Rosemeadow P.S. we expect the very best in behaviour of all students in Year 5 and 6 at ALL times. Inappropriate behaviour of any kind will not be tolerated. Behaviour will be closely monitored and tracked with the school's welfare tracking program. Teachers will endeavour to communicate all issues with parents at the earliest convenience. We encourage open communication with all issues. Please feel free to contact the school with any concerns as they arise.

Students whose behaviour is not acceptable may not be permitted to attend such events as Gala Days, camp, discos, or the Year 6 Farewell.

Our current award system will continue to celebrate student's successes and their hard work. Awards, ribbons, banners and medallions are achievable for all students. Ribbons and banners are presented to students at the fortnightly grade Assembly. Medallions and PBL awards are awarded at the end of each term.



School Leaders: Nominations Year 5

Students who wish to be considered for school leaders can self-nominate to their class teacher early in Term 4. Students will be ineligible if:

- they have been given a Formal Caution or a Suspension (beginning in Year 5, 2024)
- they have received 2 or more behaviour recordings on well-being (beginning in Year 5, 2024).

Selection Criteria for Nominations. Students will be eligible for nomination if:

- They respect themselves and others including school property as well as completing all schoolwork to the best of their ability at all times.
- They act and speak honestly as well as politely towards their peers, school staff and community members at all times.
- They always engage in safe, friendly play and co-operate by working with other students.
- They show consideration to others' feelings and differences.
- They use common sense and think about their actions.
- They always wear their school uniform with pride and participate in all relevant school activities to their best ability.
- They are willing and confident to speak in public, address an audience, etc.
- They participate actively and display enthusiasm in school activities
- They are positive role models at all times.

All captain and prefect nominees will be required to address the selection criteria in a speech during Term 4.
